2. Johnny won a game and bragged to the other kids about it.
3. Haley had on a new outfit and thought no one else looked as pretty as she did. She couldn't wait for someone to notice her new outfit, so she told everyone how pretty she looked. Was Haley proud or humble?
4. Lacey came in from playing and saw the big mess she had left in her room earlier. She knew her mom would clean it up, but she decided to go ahead and clean it up first. Was Lacey being proud or humble?
5. Daniel was hungry and wanted something to eat. He knew his mom was busy taking care of his baby brother, but he kept bothering her and whining about how hungry he was and how he wanted food right now. Was Daniel being proud or humble?
6. "Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!'" (Luke 18: 9-13). 7. "John answered them, saying, 'I baptize with water, but there stands One among you whom you do not know. It is He who, coming after me, is preferred before me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose'" (John 1: 26-27).
